### VIEWING

#### UNEMBALMED

#### TRADITIONAL FUNERAL



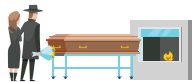
Formal service with viewing or visitation

#### HOME FUNERAL



Having the body at home for visitation

#### WITNESS CREMATION



Attending the start of the cremation process

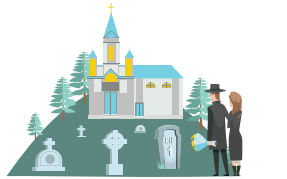
#### FAMILY DRESSING



Bathing and/or dressing of the deceased by the family

### FINAL PLACEMENT

#### INTERMENT/BURIAL



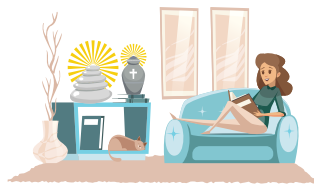
Permanent placement of any form of remains in a cemetery

#### SCATTERING



Scattering reduced remains

#### KEPT AT HOME



Reduced remains kept at residence

### DISPOSITION METHOD

#### BURIAL



Full body burial at a cemetery

#### NATURAL BURIAL



Full body burial in a manner that does not inhibit decomposition

#### FLAME CREMATION



Reducing the body using high heat flame

#### ALKALINE HYDROLYSIS



Reducing the body using heated water and lye

#### NATURAL ORGANIC REDUCTION



Reducing the body to soil using plant material

### TYPE OF REMAINS

#### CREMATED REMAINS



Flame cremation remains

#### HYDROLIZED REMAINS



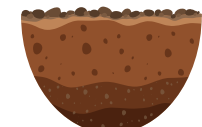
Alkaline hydrolysis remains

#### SOLIDIFIED REMAINS



Compressed cremated or hydrolyzed remains that resemble stones

#### SOIL



Natural organic reduction remains
